Historic and Archaeological Preservation in Transportation (ADC50) Native American Transportation Issues (ABE80) TRB Joint Committee Summer Meeting July 19-22, 2009, Sheridan, Wyoming

The Transportation Research Board (TRB) Committees on Historic and Archaeological Preservation in Transportation (ADC50) and Native American Transportation Issues (ABE80) will hold a **joint midyear meeting on July 19-22, 2009, in Sheridan, Wyoming.**

This meeting is an important venue for discussing current and best practices and disseminating research in support of the committees' missions, which are:

- **ADC50: Cultural resources** that transportation projects may affect, including historic properties, structures, districts, landscapes, prehistoric and historic archaeological properties, Traditional Cultural Properties, Native American Interests, 20th-century properties, and historic ethnic communities.
- **ABE80: Transportation issues** on or near tribal lands and communities or affecting tribal historical or cultural properties wherever located. Tribal transportation issues include research and practice; all modes of moving people and goods; all relevant agencies, including tribal, state, federal, regional and local providers; and all relationships and interactive processes of various governmental units—tribal, federal, state, and local—with regard to the development, planning, administration, coordination, and implementation of transportation laws, policies, plans, programs, and projects.

ADC50 and ABE80 invite papers from individuals who wish to present case studies, posters, or current research. Preliminary sessions for the summer meeting include:

1. Best practices for coordination, consultation, and communication with tribal governments
2. Integration of historic preservation and transportation planning
3. DOT contributions to regional and national prehistory
4. Identification, evaluation, and management of mid-20th century cultural resources
5. Battlefields and transportation concerns
6. Historic bridges and highways
7. Additional sessions to be determined

Proposals may be for individual papers of 20 minutes, themed papers, or a panel discussion. Posters will also be accepted for display and should be mountable on a wall. Each proposal should include:

- Presentation type (poster, paper, or session)
- Title
- Abstract (150 words)
- Presenter's contact information, including name, affiliation/organization, address, telephone and e-mail

Panel organizers should submit all paper proposals at once, accompanied by a title and a brief description of the theme or purpose. Please reference a session number, if applicable.

Abstracts or session proposals will be evaluated by the ADC50 and ABE80 Program Subcommittee, which is responsible for developing the final program. Please note that the subcommittee will reserve time on the program for papers and/or sessions at its discretion, and may schedule papers and proposals received by other means.

Other meeting highlights are:

- Field trip to the Fort Phil Kearny and Fetterman Battle National Historic Landmarks
- Tour of and dinner at the Sheridan Inn National Historic Landmark
- Walking tours of the downtown Sheridan Historic District and the Sheridan Railroad District

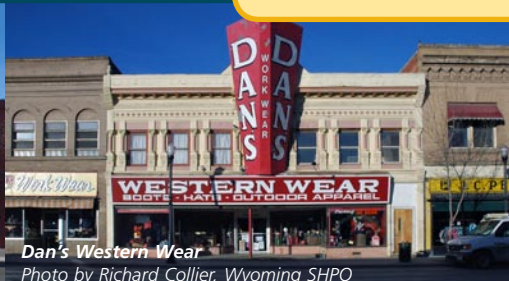
